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## Illustrations

Here is a creative activity for practicing the present continuous tense.

Procedure

Divide the class into two teams A and B.

One student from team A comes up to the board.

The student is given a present continuous card.

The student then draws the sentence without writing words or letters and without speaking.

Team A then has one minute to try to guess the sentence. They must guess exactly what's on the card.

Tell the students that the sentence always begins with a pronoun (he, she, or they).

If they cannot guess correctly after one minute, Team B can try to answer.

One point is awarded for each correct guess.

Then, team B plays and so on.

The first team to ten points wins the game.
