# Aven colony

Off-world city-builder rewards patience with deep gameplay.

Players are tasked with building and maintaining a futuristic colony on an alien world. They must navigate through many ever-changing statistics, keeping track of their colony's various needs and working on the fly to build a strong community capable of surviving the harsh off-world environment.

The game features a story focused on helping others and saving both the people and creatures of the world by building strong bonds of friendship.




# Professor Layton and the Last Specter

This game focuses on character development and helps reveal the backstories of the professor and his companions. In this installment, Professor Layton meets his new assistant Emmy and the child Luke (who becomes his apprentice in the other games), and together they try to figure out the mystery behind a ghostly figure that haunts a small town. The game's focus is on the puzzles and riddles that players must solve in order to continue.




### ReCore: Definitive Edition

It is a sci-fi action-adventure game with a strong, likable female lead in Joule, one of the only humans on a planet full of robots. She has to fight some of these robots in intense action sequences, but only the aggressive ones. Bright explosions replace the blood and gore seen in most shooters, though at one point Joule encounters a pile of dusty old human bones. It's a challenging game that demands practice and perseverance



#### Trials evolution

It is a motorcycle racing and stunt game with some violence in the form of spectacular motorcycle wipeouts. Crashes range from small but authentic (like a rider falling backwards and tumbling down a slope in realistic rag-doll fashion) to the wildly fantastical (explosions can send motorcyclists soaring hundreds of yards through the air). There is no blood or gore.



#### Broken age

It is a point-and-click adventure with some admirable messages. There are a few action sequences in which girls are scooped up by a monster's tentacles and deposited in its mouth, but there's no blood or gore, and witty dialogue keeps these scenes from being too intense. The vast majority of time is spent in conversation.



# Brothers: a tale of two sons

It's a puzzle and platforming game with almost no violence, though in one dark scene players will traverse a bloody battlefield filled with the bodies of dead giants. One of the things that makes this game special is that these two brothers make great role models. They only get into one fight with an enemy and spend the rest of the game figuring out puzzles and trying to help people. They love, cooperate with, and help one another throughout.



# Code name S.T.E.A.M.

It's a strategy game with moderate violence. Players control fictional characters as they use various weapons -- rifles, grenade launchers, shotguns -- to ward off invading aliens and protect the humans they're attacking. Combat includes screams and brief splashes of blood but nothing grisly. Allies don't die when defeated but they are revived after each battle.



#### Monster hunter 4 ultimate

It is an action adventure game that focuses heavily on combat against large fantasy creatures including dinosaurs, enormous monsters, sea creatures, and so on. Players team up to destroy these beasts using a number of weapons, ranging from swords and lances to guns, bombs, and magical strikes. Enemies cry out in pain, spray red blood, and die. The game also has some crude humor including enemies who use flatulence to poison human fighters.



#### Tacoma

It is a first-person narrative adventure game set on an abandoned space station. There's no violence. Players spend their time examining the station for clues to understand what happened to its crew. The crew - a diverse cast made up of varying religions, nationalities, genders, skin tones - behave nobly and with good intentions, often helping and soothing each other in the face of disaster.
